#### Year ended 31 March 2021

NEL Local Pharmaceutical Committee is a local representative committee of Pharmacy Contractors. The Committee is recognised by NHS England under the provisions of section 167 of the Act as representative of the pharmacy contractors in the area(s) of the following Integrated Care Boards and Health and Wellbeing Boards: -

NEL ICB, Havering H&W board, Redbridge H&W board, Barking and Dagenham H&W board, Tower Hamlets H&W board, Newham H&W board, Waltham Forest H&W board.

The Committee is recognised by NHS England in relation to pharmaceutical services (which are commissioned by NHS England). As the services that can be provided by pharmacy extend to those that may be commissioned by other commissioners including Local Authorities, the Committee will seek to gain recognition as the representative body for pharmacy contractors by building strong relationships with these other organisations.

## **Chief Executive Officer Report**

Dear colleagues,

I want to start by saying a huge Thank You for all that you have done and are doing for residents across NEL during a difficult time for Community Pharmacy. It's been another difficult year for Community Pharmacy and we have again shown how integral we are to Primary Care, to the ICB and to Local Authorities in ensuring good health and wellbeing of residents across NEL.

I'd also like to say a big Thank You to the CP NEL committee members past and present for all the support, advice and guidance that they have provided us with on behalf of contractors across NEL. The committee help shape and prioritise the work we do, highlight local issues that affect contractors and ensure good governance.

During the past year we have worked really hard to ensure that we are giving contractors the best return on their levy investment.

We have been able to give contractors a 6-month levy holiday Jan 2023-June 2023 (saving contractors £218,352) as well as taking a look at our operating budget and reducing the levy for contractors in 2022-2023 by £43,288 across the year. We have also worked closely with C&H LPC to ensure that we do what contractors asked for during the RSG vote, by merging the two LPC's so that we have a united voice across NEL. By doing this we have managed to keep the levy cost the same for contractors for 2023-2024, even though there has been an increase in levy to CPE.

CP NEL have worked closely with the ICB and Local Authorities to demonstrate the value of Community Pharmacy. In Tower Hamlets we approached the LA with a vaccine hesitancy service which they subsequently commissioned up to £50,000. In total 3098 consultations were completed and 45% of patients went on to have a COVID vaccination. In Dec 2022 we received an award on behalf of all contractors across NEL, at the NEL Workforce Awards, recognising the contribution of Community Pharmacy in vaccinating and protecting NEL residents against COVID and Flu.

The ICB have worked closely with CP NEL and have recognised our contribution in the Primary Care sector. They have set up a Pharmacy Provider Group which meets every 6 weeks to discuss Community Pharmacy and how we fit into Primary Care and all the things we can offer. The ICB last year paid for IT integration for CPCS and this year they extended that to Hypertension/ABPM and also to Oral Contraception referrals, ready for when our contractors start the service. They have also paid for PharmAlarms for every pharmacy. Having this IT in place has meant that there is a smooth pathway from GP systems into PharmOutcomes and back again following a consultation. IT is often a barrier to referrals, but in NEL, we have not had that particular barrier and as a result have had 54,257 GP CPCS referrals from GP to CP 2022-2023 giving contractors a possible income of £759,598. BP clinic checks (3030) and ABPM (2235) has given us a possible income of £146,625.

We have had many requests for putting up posters and giving out leaflets, whilst we encourage Community Pharmacy not to do anything for free, it's important that CP NEL relay this message to local groups and commissioners too, as a result we recently received funding for 85 pharmacies to put up two posters and to hand out leaflets to a targeted group of patients (£12,750).



There are many other services we have worked on locally such as a Smoking cessation service in Redbridge and Havering. We have also negotiated an increase in remuneration for services as contracts are being renewed such as Substance Misuse, Sexual Health and Smoking Cessation in Tower Hamlets and Substance Misuse in Havering.

Throughout the year we have invited key stakeholders to visit Community Pharmacies across NEL to showcase the great work that you all do. We visited pharmacies (Boots Ilford, Superdrug Ilford, Ropharm Ilford) with Paul Guilley the Chief Medical Officer for NEL NHS, he was very impressed with all that we do and all that we can offer to the local community. Since then, he has ensured that we are being invited to represent Community Pharmacy at key meetings so that our voice is heard and is integrating Community Pharmacy at meetings that he attends. Following this we invited Jo Moss the Chief Strategy and Transformation Officer to Salus Pharmacy in Stratford who was also in awe of the role that Community Pharmacy play in local communities.

After many emails to various MP's, we were able to showcase Fairlop Pharmacy in Redbridge to Wes Streeting the Shadow Health Secretary along with Janet Morrison from CPE. Wes spent a lot of time listening to us as we shared the positives of Community Pharmacy as well as the challenges that we face and how we need change and action quickly. We took the Associate Medical Director for Primary Care, NEL NHS, Ben Molyneux, to Britannia Pharmacy in Redbridge and we also invited the London Regional Chief Pharmacist Jon Hayhurst along to Docklands Pharmacy Newham. All these visitors were surprised at what we do and what we can do, and this has opened many positive conversations for the future in terms of services and funding opportunities.

Thank You for all that you do. CP NEL is here to support you over the year ahead.
